We need to investigate level of effort and determine which year to target (2019 or later). **Committee elections** — Committee officers (chair, vice chair, treasurer, **NOVEMBER** secretary) and representative to BSC board, for terms starting on January 1, 2020. **Light City Festival / Book Festival** — Contribute to the joint BSC, Inc. **NOVEMBER** 1-10 presence at this festival (pending decisions to be made by BSC about participation in this event). **DECEMBER WTCI Maryland Global Gala** — Contribute to the joint BSC, Inc. booth (pending decisions to be made by BSC about participation in this event). **ONGOING** Maryland-Netherlands Cybersecurity Soft Landing Program — Continue to help Maryland and Netherlands promote the program, encourage companies to apply, and provide hospitality to participating companies. **DC-area Dutch networking happy hour** — BRSCC is a co-sponsor of the periodic ongoing business networking "borrel" organized by the Netherlands Embassy, NACCWM, and other DC-area Dutch organizations. MICA/WdKA sister academy relationship — Continue to promote the Unravel the Code digital fabrication course, co-taught by the art academies in Baltimore (Maryland Institute College of Art, MICA) and Rotterdam (Willem de Kooning Academy, WdKA). **OTHER GOALS Social Impact by Design** — We are exploring having IMG Rebel coordinate a Social Impact by Design project in Baltimore, similar to a new pilot started in the BoTu neighborhood of Rotterdam by IMG Rebel. **K-12 Green Mapping educational exchange** — Stay alert for opportunities to engage Rotterdam partners in a K-12 level Green Map Exchange in the future, as a standalone project or in conjunction with another program. Could be done as a multi-BSC committee (e.g. Xiamen, Kawasaki) endeavor. Medtech Build on committee member Ben Arthur's initial matchmaking discussions with Maryland companies in 2018 about partnering with Dutch companies. Our hope is that several partnerships will get going and commercial exchange happens. Explore options for having Maryland and South Holland set up a medtech soft landing program in the future to help companies explore business opportunities in each other's markets. **Storm water management** — Continue to investigate possible knowledge exchanges with DC/Baltimore/Rotterdam on storm water management (flood

resiliency). Identify funding sources to send someone from the Office of

	Sustainability to Rotterdam, e.g. attend Rotterdam's Climate Academy, or make this part of the new upcoming Baltimore Ambassadors Program if it gets approved by city government.
• •	Green building — Consider getting involved in projects related to sustainable architecture. As a first step, invite Karina Mandell to lecture at MSU School of Architecture + Planning about the Baltimore EcoDistrict initiative.
•	International architecture student internships — Help place students in internships in Baltimore and Rotterdam.
••	Business database — Continued building database of businesses with interests in our region and Rotterdam or the Netherlands.
•	Expand membership — Recruit more committee members to broaden talents/strengths of our program, including people who can help with operations and fundraising, fulfill officer positions in upcoming election, coordinate education & arts projects, and execute our other initiatives.
•	Rotterdam-Baltimore sister city committee — Support and strengthen the new sister city committee, based in Rotterdam.
