ENOCH PRATT *free* LIBRARY

Enoch Pratt Free Library (EPFL) is Baltimore’s public library system. In 2025, under the leadership of its President and CEO Chad Helton, EPFL embarked on a new collaboration with Baltimore Sister Cities, including three research trips to our sister cities and several special activities in Baltimore. Goals include initiating knowledge exchanges with overseas libraries and planning for a new international library summit to be hosted by EPFL.

Trip to Egypt JUNE


EPFL representatives (President/CEO, Chief Financial Officer, Chief of the State Library Resource Center, and an Archivist) visited Cairo and Alexandria in Egypt. In Cairo, the group visited Cairo and Ain Shams Universities. These visits were arranged by the Egyptian Cultural and Educational Bureau in Washington, D.C. The group also visited historical pyramids. In Alexandria, the group had two days of visits to the Bibliotheca Alexandrina (BA). There were tours of the library’s extensive collection and small museums on the first day, followed by lunch and conversations with BA staff on the second day. While in Alexandria, the Baltimore-Luxor-Alexandria Sister City Committee (BLASCC) hosted the group for dinner at the Greek Club overlooking the Mediterranean Sea.

Trip to China JULY

EPFL representatives visited Xiamen in China, facilitated by Baltimore-Xiamen Sister City Committee (BXSCC). The program included meetings with the Xiamen Library leadership and librarians, visits to Xiamen Museum and Xiamen University, and a Welcome Ceremony at the Jimei branch of Xiamen Library for EPFL and Baltimore Youth Ambassadors. They met Xiamen city leaders, a book publishing company, and an American Chinese author. They also attended some of the cultural activities in Xiamen that were part of the Baltimore Youth Ambassadors’ itinerary.

Enoch Pratt Free Library (EPFL) and BXSCC collaborated to create an exhibition at the Central Library about Baltimore and Xiamen's 40-year sister city relationship, in four display cases. Exhibition included photos of Xiamen, copies of the original sister city agreement, examples of student and professional exchanges over the years, information about Baltimore Sister Cities and activities held annually by BSC's Asian sister committees to celebrate contributions of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders to Baltimore.





BLASCC hosted a special event at Enoch Pratt's Central Library with Assistant Curator Dr. Meg Swaney of the Johns Hopkins University Archaeological Museum, and Egyptian cuisine. Dr. Swaney gave a presentation about "A Baltimorean in Egypt", highlighting how Mr. Mendes Israel Cohen of Baltimore, a banker who fought at Fort McHenry in the War of 1812, traveled to Egypt in 1832, collecting 689 artifacts. Mr. Cohen is believed to be the first person to fly an American flag on the Nile River, and his collection is now in the Johns Hopkins museum.

The Asian Arts & Culture Center at Towson University hosted *HAUNTED KOREAS Dreaming Unification Protest Peace* exhibition, featuring Mina Cheon’s series of “Unification Dream” paintings, a new perspective on the flags of a unified Korea. Each of these paintings is a powerful peace protest, shedding light on the intricacies of communication, love, and a shared vision of a harmonious future for North and South Korea. Mina Cheon (PhD, MFA) is a global Korean new media artist, scholar, and educator who divides her time between Baltimore, New York, and Seoul, Korea. The Opening Reception and Artists Talk on Feb 22 was co-sponsored by BCSCC and the Korean American Foundation – Greater Washington.

Asia North Festival during Asian American, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander Month (AANHPIM)

BCSCC participated in Baltimore’s Asia North Festival, an annual festival celebrating AANHPIM that is coordinated by Towson University’s Asian Arts & Culture Center. BCSCC and the Korean American Foundation – Greater Washington hosted a Koreatown walking tour with tour guide Sein Kim and MC Rosa Park, showcasing Charles North neighborhood’s Koreatown history and Korean cuisine, followed by a book talk and reception with Ginger Park and Frances Park, the authors of *Suka’s Farm*, a book inspired by their father’s boyhood when Korea was occupied by Japan.

Young African Leaders (Mandela Washington Fellowship)

University of Maryland Baltimore County hosted a cohort of Young African Leaders (Mandela Washington Fellowship), empowering emerging leaders across Africa through leadership training, networking, and community impact. BGSCC and Maryland Sister States helped sponsor a community running event during this cohort’s visit.

Health, Food Security, and Environment

Healthcare — Collaborated with Cuttington University engaged with other institutions on developing initiatives to strengthen this sector, focusing on capacity building, workforce development, and sustainable healthcare systems in Liberia.

Ending Period Poverty — Continued BGSCC’s partnership with this organization, led by Eta Beta Omega Chapter of AKA Sorority. Feminine hygiene products are not easily acquired or accessible in many parts of the world. Providing these items significantly increases quality of life for girls and women.

Food as Medicine — Supported initiatives centered on food as medicine, collaborating with several major farms in surrounding areas on pilot programs to promote nutrition, wellness, and preventative health approaches.

African Environmental Watch International — Participated in AEW’s Climate Literacy in Action conference at University of Maryland College Park, supporting youth engagement and workforce development in environment and engineering.

African Diaspora Global Engagement

Partnered with African Diaspora Alliance and Kenyan Diaspora Alliance. Participated in National Business League’s 125th Anniversary Celebration, and in Atlantic Council’s convening with Macky Sall, former president of Senegal and past chairperson of the African Union.

Finding Identity and Honoring Tradition Through Ukrainian Pottery exhibition at Howard County Library in Ellicott City featured pottery by Natalia Kormeluk, ceramic artist and Hood College graduate program instructor, and by resident artists from the National Museum of Ukrainian Pottery. Natalia Kormeluk teaches Ukrainian-influenced ceramic art to new creators domestically and during residencies at the National Museum of Ukrainian Pottery in Opishne, Ukraine.
